¹ For students who are studying in the EU but hold passports from countries that have a visa regime with Bosnia and Herzegovina, we need to receive their nominations much earlier. This is because the process of regulating their visa status (if they are positively evaluated by our faculty coordinators) can take several months, depending on the country of origin. By this date we need their nomination and application.



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	* nomination of staff members is flexible – minimum of 2-3 months before planned mobility. If staff needs visa to enter B&H it should be minimum of 6 months.
Application	Nominated students and staff members will receive an email for sending application documents: • Learning Agreement / Mobility Agreement (with included personal data and study/work proposal) Application deadlines: 1st / Winter Semester • If visa to enter B&H is needed: 15 April • If visa to enter B&H is not needed: 30 May 2nd / Summer Semester • If visa to enter B&H is needed: 15 October • If visa to enter B&H is not needed: 30 November
Acceptance	After receiving the application documents, the candidate will be evaluated by academic coordinators. Students/staff members will be notified about acceptance, modification, or rejection with an explanation.

It is the student's responsibility to contact each professor as early as possible in the application process and definitely before finalizing travel plans in case they need to return to their home universities before the end of the exchange semester at University of Sarajevo.

Language requirements	The University of Sarajevo recommends language level B2 in local language (Bosnian/Croatian/Serbian) in order to take full advantage of the mobility. Students who will only take courses in English must have B2 English knowledge. Students who will only take courses in English must check whether they can find enough English-taught courses to fulfil their home university's credit requirements.

² Classes are in the local language, but students can do exams, research, mentorship, tutorials, and paperwork in English.

Visa and Residence Permit	Students and staff who need a visa to enter Bosnia and Herzegovina must follow instructions and deadlines as it takes a long time to provide a visa. All students staying longer than 90 days must regulate their Residence permit. Health Insurance	Insurance must cover student/staff health and life activities in Sarajevo during their stay. It will be required to purchase insurance in Sarajevo, as it will be crucial in regulating their residence permit.
